Pointe Schools COVID-19 Mitigation Plan

Pointe Schools will implement the following mitigation strategies and protocols:

- Screen students and staff before entering campus for temperature, symptoms, and history.
- Require cloth face masks on campus for anyone over the age of five (5) (other than exceptions in Governor's Executive Order 2020-51).
- Ensure hands are washed frequently and hand sanitizer is readily available.
- Educate students about healthy community practices to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Clean and disinfect campus nightly and clean high touch surfaces throughout the day.
- Encourage social distancing by altering processes when feasible and necessary.
- Provide ongoing health and safety training for faculty and staff.
- Limit materials going back and forth to school and disinfect shared items.
- Require staff and students with COVID-19 symptoms to stay home.

Free, On-site Learning Opportunities

Pointe Schools plans to offer in-person instruction beginning on August 17, 2020 for students whose families selected on-campus learning for the quarter. Upon the release of the state reopening benchmarks, this timeline may change. Updates will be provided as needed.

Distance Learning Plan

Pointe Schools has a detailed distance learning plan. It is posted at pointeschools.org and on each school's website (northpointeprep.com, mycanyon.org, goppa.org).

Attendance Policy

School begins August 3rd with remote learning. Students and families are required to follow the guidelines provided by their school for attendance documentation (K-6, parent attestation; 7-12 attendance taken by teacher during each scheduled class time). Students will receive an unexcused absence if they have not met the criteria for attendance that day and their parent/guardian has not notified the school of the absence by 9:00 am on the day of the absence (see Student Handbook Attendance Policy).

State law requires every parent or person who has custody of a child between the ages of 6 and 16 to ensure the child attends school for the full time the school is in session. A student may have an excused absence if unable to attend due to illness or other legitimate reason (A.R.S. 15-802, 15-803). As required by state law, students shall be withdrawn from school on their 10th consecutive day of unexcused absences.
